In our culture we avoid talking about the end of life matters. However, we sense it does not have to be this way and we wonder if we can create a new culture in which dying and death are not feared, but approached and met with reverence and wonder as other important times in our lives.



Lakshmi will share her deep understanding of birth and death from an Anthroposophical perspective. She will speak on the mysteries before and during birth and what mysteries are in front of us when we're dying or witnessing the process of dying and death – and the big question, what takes place just after death?

Lakshmi in her work in India around birth has been deeply involved in the arenas of birth and death. It is through her professional and very personal interest in this subject that has led her to being able to reintroduce participants to a renewed reverence for life and death as she focusses on the beginning and the completion of our physical lives.
